Prayers for Christmas I

A: Gracious Father, we give you thanks for the offering of your Son, whose name is Jesus. He is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world. Washed in His blood, our robes are made perfectly white and we are declared completely holy. By faith alone, we are heirs of promise, clothed so to speak in the righteousness of the One who is “Word made flesh”. Grant that we may always be faithful to you as You are to us. Lord in your mercy,

C: Hear our prayer.

A: Holy God, you have placed your name upon us and revealed your face in the likeness of Jesus. In Him we receive the gift of real presence and the true joy of Christmas. Grant us, we pray, the true circumcision of the heart, that we may bless others with the blessing we ourselves have received from you. Lord in your mercy,

C: Hear our prayer.

A: Eternal God, you live beyond the realm of time, untouched by its passage. From everlasting to everlasting you are God. For that great grace we thank you, Lord, that you have come to dwell among us. We pray that Christ’s own presence may accompany us into the year ahead, that each day may be lived for you and your glory. Lord in your mercy,

C: Hear our prayer.

A: Holy Comforter, be the strength and assurance of those who grieve the death of loved ones. Surround them with your love and give them that peace which passes all human understanding. Grant healing to those who battle illnesses and restore them by your grace. Be with those we name before you this night that they may rest in your saving presence (**NAMES**). Lord in your mercy,

C: Hear our prayer.

P: Into your hands, Merciful Father, we commend all for whom we pray, trusting in your mercy, for the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Scripture Readings—Christmas I

Numbers 6:22-27 — Aaron's Blessing

22 The Lord spoke to Moses, saying, 23 “Speak to Aaron and his sons, saying, Thus you shall bless the people of Israel: you shall say to them, 24 The Lord bless you and keep you; 25 the Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; 26 the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace. 27 “So shall they put my name upon the people of Israel, and I will bless them.”

Lesson: Galatians 3:23-29 — Now That Faith Has Come!

23 Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed. 24 So then, the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith. 25 But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian, 26 for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. 27 For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. 28 There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. 29 And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to promise.

Gospel Lesson: Luke 2:21 — Circumcised and Named

21 And at the end of eight days, when he was circumcised, he was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb.
