Pastor’s Keyboard: “Discipleship - “A Little Proud”

Prophecy is fulfilled when Jesus enters the Holy City of Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. “Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he, humble & mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.”—Zechariah 9:9.

Discipleship: “Less of me and more of Thee”. Not too proud. I’m a little proud. What are you most proud of? Is it hubris or God-given pride. St. Peter writes, “Be humbled under the mighty hand of God and in due time He will exalt you.” Mary in her Magnificat sings praises to God, for He has “looked on the humble estate of His servant. He has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts. He has brought the mighty down from their thrones and exalted those of humble estate.”

This month, in honor of our Lord’s passion and resurrection, we are reflecting on the Christ Hymn in Philippians 2: “Have this mind among



yourselves, which is already yours in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.”

LENT: HOLY WEEK

Thanks to everyone who made Midweek Lenten Services a discipline in their faith walk with Jesus. Palm Fronds were distributed in honor of Palm & Passion Sunday. Our Maundy Thursday Worship is a foot washing service with Holy Communion at 6pm. Our Good Friday Service is at 12:00 Noon with the Bidding Prayer and a reading of the Passion Story. Easter will be celebrated with Worship on Holy Saturday at 6pm. Buried Alleluias will return and the Resurrection of our Lord will be celebrated.

Public Reading of the New Testament

Have you ever read the entire Bible? Martin Luther read the Bible from cover to cover at least two times every year. In the 1500's, he translated the Bible into the common language of the people. He sang all 150 psalms each month during the hours of prayer. Luther had most of the Bible committed to memory.

Two years ago, during the Fifty Days of Easter, Emmanuel Members collectively read the entire New Testament. In celebration of God's great gift of Scripture, and our Lord's Resurrection, Emmanuel Lutheran will host a public reading of the New Testament this year. It is estimated that reading the entire Bible takes about 72 hours (56 hours for the Old Testament and 16 hours for the New Testament).

The Public Reading of the New Testament will take place on **Monday, March 28 from 6am - 10pm at Oasis Church.** If you would like to participate in the public reading of God's Word, serving as a Scripture Reader or Greeter, please contact Pastor Dave Steffenson. Feel free to drop by Oasis Church for a portion of the day. Bring your Bible and pack a lunch and a thermos, if you wish. We'll have snacks, beverages and door prizes.

One day, 16 hours. An amazing way to celebrate Easter and hear the Good News spoken out loud. Join us for a portion of the day, or the entire day!

word humility comes from the Latin word *humus* which means soil or earth. The word human comes from *humus*. An earthling was created by God from the earth to be “down to earth”. Humility is not a matter of self-deprecation. It is the gift of being “human” in God’s fullest sense of the word. Humility is not thinking less of yourself, but rather, thinking of yourself less, and others more. The two great commandments sum up humility and the mind of Christ: “Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind and strength, and your neighbor as yourself.” We love others best when we love God most!

In II Chronicles 7:11 we hear that the Jerusalem Temple is completed. Solomon dedicates it as the House of the LORD. A feast is celebrated and sacrifices are offered. The LORD appears to Solomon and says, “If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land.” A little pride is a good thing. Repentance and prayer, seeking God’s will in daily life, a down-to-earth attitude and the mind of Christ, are all marks of Discipleship. Discipleship is the fruit of our salvation IN CHRIST. Those who are humbled with Christ are also exalted with Christ. Those whom God foreknows, He also predestines, and conforms into the image of His Son. God calls, justifies, sanctifies, and glorifies His elect. Buried with Christ in a death like His, we shall also certainly be united with Christ in a resurrection like His. Not too proud!

Christ humbled Himself and was obedient unto the Father’s will; even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted Him and bestowed on Him the name that is above all names. At the name of JESUS, every knee in all times and places will bow, and every tongue will confess that Jesus is LORD to the glory of God the Father. Christ lives in us. We are His body; His bride; His temple. And so by faith, we exercise the mind of Christ and the name of Jesus in daily life. We work out our own salvation with fear and trembling, for God is at work in us both to will and to work for His good pleasure. We are Easter People. We are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. Jesus is the Great I AM. “I AM” humbled for me and for you ... for the forgiveness of sins! Christ is Risen. He is Risen Indeed! — *I AM Humbled, Pastor Dave*
