Pastor’s Keyboard: “Discipleship: The Good WORD!”

“But in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with meekness and fear”—I Peter 3:15.

I Peter is a baptismal homily written to the scattered seeds of Asia Minor, the elect who are chosen for obedience to Jesus Christ & for sprinkling with His blood. “Baptism now saves you”—I Peter 3:21.

Martin Luther, commenting on I Peter 3:21, writes: “Now baptism is by far a greater flood than was that of Noah....Baptism drowns all sorts of men throughout the world, from the birth of Christ even till the day of judgment....[Noah’s flood] was a flood of wrath, this is a flood of grace.”

I’ve got a new friend. His name is Eric. He’s a brother in the Lord. He works, or shall I say, serves, at the Fareway Grocery Store in Rochester. What draws me to Eric is the love of Jesus. Eric wears a cross as he works. His Christ-centered, gentle demeanor, SHOUTS the love of Jesus!

One day, while wearing a clerical shirt, I picked up a



few items at Fareway. Eric looked at me and said, “So what’s the Good Word for today, Reverend?” I paused, stumbled a bit, and then answered, “It’s Jesus. It’s always Jesus. Jesus is the eternal Word of God; the Good Word; yesterday, today & forever!”

It’s not rocket science when it comes to sharing God’s Word & our faith with others. St. John writes, “In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God. All things were made through Him. ... And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son of the Father, full of grace and truth.”

In 2017, Carmen LaBerge, a graduate of Princeton Theological Seminary,

wrote a book entitled, “Speak the Truth: How to bring God back into every conversation”. Carmen reminds her readers that the baptismal calling of every child of God is to speak the TRUTH. Jesus is the Way and the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father, except through Jesus. Carmen invites us to walk the faith of Jesus in every arena of our life.

When communicating the TRUTH, Carmen reminds us of some important DO’s and DON’Ts. Don’t feel like you have to have something to say about everything. Don’t respond defensively. Don’t get in the way. It’s not about you. We are not the Good News. Jesus is the Good News. We are God’s ambassadors; agents of God’s grace. God’s plan isn’t going to fail, just because we fail. Remember, “Arguments are not won. People are won.”

On Reconnect One: "In the Way"

I wasn't trying to eavesdrop, but I also couldn't help but hear the grunting accusation, "Get out of my way. You're always in the way!" I looked at the defeated face of the child doing her best to steer clear of the cart her mother was maneuvering through the grocery store aisle. And figuring I had one second to respond before the window of opportunity closed, I blurted out, "Oh! I'm so sorry! I didn't realize I was in the way!" The woman looked up with a furrowed expression and the child smiled slightly in my direction. I heard myself say, "You know I get in the way a lot. I'm a Christian and I like to think I'm following Jesus in the Way, but sometimes I just get in the way!" The woman's expression softened and the tightness melted from her shoulders. She stood there staring at me over her grocery cart and then she looked at her daughter. "Jenny, I'm so sorry. You're not in my way." What are some of the DO's? Pray for the soil that God is preparing. God always goes before us. Get prayed up! We have divine appointments. Focus on people, not issues. Relationships matter. We need to do our homework. Know the Word. What is the hope that is within you? We can “make a defense to anyone who asks us for a reason for the hope that is in us”. We can do it without getting defensive or argumentative. We can do it with meekness and reverence.

A pastor friend recently said to me, “We preach Law and Gospel, but sometimes people don't see joy in our words of gospel or tears in our words of law.” Carmen LaBerge shares this story: “I was getting coffee at the local Starbucks. A young gal was seated at the common table, doodling. I noticed the gal's drawings, sat down by her, and said, ‘I see that you are drawing some very dark pictures.’ The gal appeared to be suicidal. I arranged to meet up with her again the next day. But on the next day she was a ‘no show’. She did however leave a note with the barista that said, ‘You're one of those nasty Jesus people’—signed Sarah. I was in tears. I wept as I exited out to my car. I sat in my car crying. Then there was a knock on the passenger window. It was Sarah. For several minutes we visited through the car window about her caustic note. A few weeks later I found a note on the windshield of my car from Sarah. It said, ‘Thanks for being a perfect stranger.’” We are responsible for bringing the presence of Christ into the lives of others.

We are God's mouthpieces, bearers of God's Good Word. “What's the Good News, preacher?” Thanks for asking Eric. The answer is always Jesus. May God help us get Jesus back into every conversation. What better word have we to offer than the WORD of God? The Word becomes flesh and dwells among us full of grace and truth. Jesus Always!
