Pastor’s Keyboard: “Discipleship: “The Jonah Complex”

God opens doors that no one can shut. God shuts doors that no one can open. The LORD is the Door Keeper. TRUTH be told, shared and proclaimed, “Jesus IS The Door of the sheep”. The Great I AM offers these promising words: “Amen, Amen. I, I AM the door. If anyone enters by me, they will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture”—John 10:7-10. Salvation is good news, “for me.” But what about, “for others?”

John Ortberg writes, “God is the God of open doors. He opens doors all around, boundless opportunities to contribute to humanity in ways large and small, to make our lives count for eternity. Who could not want that? I could not want that” (from: All the Places to Go, page 181).

We long for open doors and yet we often resist going through them. Abraham Maslow referred to our evasion and avoidance of destiny as “the Jonah Complex.” Every time God opens a door for someone in the Bible there is a little tug-of-war. The story of Jonah is a prime example. Gregg Levoy refers to the prophet Jonah as the “patron saint of refused callings.” Bottom



line: God always wins. “His yes is louder than our no.”

Ortberg writes, “Sometimes doors are not fun. Sometimes they’re not even safe. Always they’re about something greater than our own benefit. Often they lead to Nineveh. Nineveh is the place God calls you where you do not want to go. Nineveh is trouble. Nineveh is danger. Nineveh is fear. What do you do when God says to you, ‘Go to Nineveh; go to the place you do not want to go?’ Because God will say that to you”—page 187.

“God says, ‘Go.’ Jonah says, ‘No.’ God says, ‘blow.’ Jonah says, ‘So?’ The captain says, ‘Bro.’ Jonah says, ‘Throw.’ The sailors say, ‘Whoa!’ So they tossed Jonah in and he sank very low, But God had more places for Jonah to go.”—page 197

Who/what is your Nineveh? The name Jonah means “Dove,” a metaphor for Israel. Jonah’s story is our

story. Jonah is the son of Amittai. The word Amittai means “faithfulness,” but Jonah is not exactly a great example of faithfulness. Jonah resists his God-given destiny. He is a “long-distance runner” of sorts. God commissions Jonah to go to Nineveh and preach against it. According to the prophet Nahum, Nineveh was “a city of blood, full of lies, full of plunder, never without victims.... Piles of dead.” So Jonah runs!

Jonah has what might be called situation avoidance. Jonah resists God’s call and boards a ship headed for Tarshish. He is running away from the presence of the LORD, which of course we all know is impossible to do. Ironically, Jonah’s fleeing actually results in the conversion of pagan sailors. God uses Jonah’s failure, to bring unsaved people to faith. The Book of Jonah is not a story about a human plan. “It is an ‘opened’ door, and we are not the openers.”

This statement of faith became known as the Augsburg Confession. This document was penned by Luther's dear friend Philip Melanchthon, and is considered to be the bedrock & summary of what it means to be Lutheran. The Augsburg Confession is a true confession of the Christian faith because Christ Himself is expressed in it. This study is an opportunity for growing deeper in one's Lutheran identity & walk of discipleship. The LORD commissions a BIG FISH to swallow His chosen ambassador, Jonah. In the belly of the fish, Jonah repents and prays. The LORD hears and forgives. The LORD commands the Big Fish to vomit Jonah onto dry land. Jonah's resurrection, if you will, takes place on the "third day". In the life of Jesus, the sign of Jonah will become a foreshadowing of our Lord's resurrection...on the third day (Easter)—Matthew 12:40. The third day is an open door for you!

Jonah gets a second chance. God opens another door for Jonah. Will the repentant Jonah be faithful? He preaches a "fire-and-brimstone" sermon in Nineveh and waits for God to lower the boom. Ironically, the entire city repents and the LORD forgives them. "What is great to God—grace to Nineveh—is great evil to Jonah. Jonah pouts and sulks. Jonah screams, "I knew it!" Then he quotes the most famous confession of God's identity in the history of Israel (Exodus 34:6): "You are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love, & relenting from disaster."

The LORD isn't done with Jonah's story, or our story for that matter. God appoints a leafy plant to provide shade for Jonah. God appoints a worm, a scorching east wind, and the sun to do its duty. The LORD asks Jonah a question, "Do you do well to be angry. Jonah slams the door in God's face and says, "Angry enough to die." God gets the last word. It's a question. Ortberg writes, "There's a door out there with your name on it. Right now. It's open. What will you do?"

Is the Jonah Complex a problem for you? It is for me. I don't always like the doors that God opens. Like Jonah, I resist, refuse and run. But God is faithful, even when I am not, for He cannot deny Himself. He is a Prodigal Father, and Jesus is an open door for me and for you! God's yes is louder than our no, requiring perhaps a big fish & a little vomit.

THE SEX BOMB: Prayers for ECC

Human sexuality continues to be an explosive issue in both our culture and our church denominations.

In MINNEAPOLIS, MN, on June 22, 2018, after intense debate, delegates to the 133rd Annual Meeting of the Evangelical Covenant Church (ECC), defeated a motion that would have added an agenda item that would call for forming a task force for the purpose of studying the denomination's stance on sexuality. The vote was 538 (64.56%) to 294 (35.35%). The denomination's official guiding position is, "*Faithfulness in heterosexual marriage, celibacy in singleness.*" Recently, on June 27, 2019, in Omaha, NE, the Evangelical Covenant Church voted to remove a Minneapolis church from its roster for being "out of harmony on human sexuality." Two pastors were also expelled from the ECC. Please pray for our brothers and sisters in the Evangelical Covenant Church (ECC).
