Pastor’s Keyboard: “Discipleship: “Coming Clean”

“Ashes to Ashes, Dust to Dust.” Discipleship is a daily walk of repentance. In worship we sing these words: “Create in me a clean heart O God & renew a right Spirit within me.” We petition God to wash us thoroughly and to make us clean. In Adam all die; so also in Christ shall all be made alive.

We lay our sins on Jesus the spotless Lamb of God. He bears them all, and frees us from the accursed load. We bring our guilt to Jesus, to wash our crimson stains. White in His blood most precious, till not a spot remains.

The Season of Lent begins with the imposition of Ashes and Psalm 51. Psalm 51 is one of 7 penitential psalms in the Book of Psalms (6, 32, 38, 51, 102, 130, & 143). Recently, we heard the preaching of Jonah: “40 Days & Nineveh shall be reduced to ashes.” The last thing Jonah wanted for Nineveh was repentance and forgiveness. The Word of God was preached & the entire city repented. People, animals, and even the King put on sackcloth and ashes. God heard the sinner’s cry for mercy and God repented of the evil He intended to do to Nineveh.

In the Season of Lent, we confess with Jonah that



“salvation belongs to the LORD.” Deliverance is God’s business. As workers in the Vineyard, the Master gives grace to His servants, and asks, “Is your eye evil because I am good.” Our God is “gracious and merciful, slow to anger & abounding in steadfast love & repents of evil.”

“If we confess our sins, God is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.”

—1 John 1:8

When someone has sinned, or done wrong, Mercy invites the sinner to fess up, to come clean, & to behold the gift of a new creation. “Against Thee only have I sinned and done what is evil in Thy sight.” King David committed adultery with Bathsheba, the wife of Uriah the Hittite. David tried to cover up his sin. He plotted the murder of Uriah. Eventually, confronted by the LORD, through the lips of the Prophet Nathan, David owned his sin: “I have sinned against the

LORD.” Nathan spoke absolution to a repentant sinner: “The LORD has put away your sin. You shall not die.” The wages of sin is death. The innocent one—the child—pays the price for David’s sin.

St. John in his first epistle reminds us that “the blood of Jesus—God’s Son—cleanses us from all sin.” Claiming that we are not sinners makes God a liar. “If we say that we have not sinned, the TRUTH (Jesus) is not in us. We have an advocate with the Father. Jesus is the propitiation for our sins and for the sins of the whole world.

King David, in Psalm 51, reminds us that confession and forgiveness is not *quid pro quo*. We have no right to have our sins forgiven. God’s steadfast love is our only hope! David pleads with God to wash him thoroughly—not a mild bathing, but a serious scrubbing. We need our sins blotted out. With hyssop our sins are purged & the Lamb’s blood protects us from the angel of death.


RED KETTLE

The Legend of the Lenten Pretzel

In AD 600, monks living in monasteries devoted much of their lives to Prayer and Bible Reading. Monks usually made and grew their own food. Tradition says that a monk took some leftover dough and shaped it into thin strips crossed into a looped twist to be like the folded arms of children in prayer. This treat was given to the children as they learned their prayers. The treat was called “*Pretiola*”, which means “little reward” in Latin; aka *Bracellae* (German). Soon it was known the world over as a pretzel. The simple shape of the pretzel, reminds us to pray every day. Some families place a pretzel on the dinner plate each night during the 40 Days of Lent. Jesus said, “When you pray.” He assumed that prayer will be a faith practice of the Church (Matthew 6). Lent is a time when God’s people remember what Jesus gave up for us – his body and blood – his life on the cross. Lent is a time when we think of what we can give up in honor of Jesus (a personal sacrifice). So enjoy those pretzels during Lent. Fold your arms and pray!

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God passes over our sins and we are given a contrite heart and the joy of God's salvation. The LORD opens our lips and we declare God's praise. The Lenten Fast concludes, and commences, with the Easter Hallelujahs. The one who is forgiven much, forgives much, and teaches transgressors the way of the LORD. Confession is not only an individual matter, it is a communal responsibility. We are in bondage to sin and we cannot free ourselves. Sin for us is original and actual. Weekly, in worship, we confess our sins with humble & contrite hearts. Weekly, in worship, we hear the words of Jesus, "I forgive you all your sins." Weekly, in worship, we receive the real presence of Jesus—crucified and risen—for the forgiveness of our sins. "Softly & tenderly Jesus is calling; calling O Sinner come home." Disciples come clean!

He did the same with Islam and the Quran and found both to be in error. Converting to Christianity was a costly path for Nabeel, but one that claimed his heart, set him free from sin & fear, and gave him eternal peace. Formerly an ambassador for Islam, Nabeel became an Ambassador for Jesus. In 2017, at the age of 34, he lost his battle with stomach cancer, but by faith in Jesus Christ received the promise of heaven.

Church Council Highlights - January 17: Excellent giving in the month of December! Total income of

\$22,834.98, expenses of \$10,340.76, and a surplus of \$12,494.22. YTD budget surplus was \$4,872.25. This was our second year in a row *in the black*. Stewardship letter & year-end giving statements have been sent out. Pastor Dave gave a health update indicating that surveillance is the recommended choice for his prostate cancer. Lent is fast approaching: soup suppers and drama series this year. Also, a Fat Tuesday celebration to raise funds for acolyte robes. Two items will be discussed at this year's Annual Meeting: A church retreat and the launch of a Bldg. Fund. The church council moved that offerings given to Emmanuel need to be for church approved items & causes. 63 Discipleship Covenants (50 adults & 13 youth) were approved for 2018.

2017 goals were reviewed & 2018 goals were established. Thank you to Don Holtan for coordinating snow removal at Oasis Church on Mondays. The next Council Meeting will be on Friday, February 9th at 3pm.
