Pastor’s Keyboard: “Discipleship—gods at war”

The Ten Commandments begin with a word of promise: “I AM the LORD your God.” The great I AM who I AM for whom I Choose to be, The LORD God Almighty, binds himself as “for you” as opposed to “against you”. Then follows an essential prohibition: “You shall have no other gods (period)!”

Some add the words “before” or “besides” assuming that God is content with rivals as long as God is first. But our God is a jealous God, a consuming fire, tolerating no competition (Exodus 34:14; Deuteronomy 4:24). Our God is exclusive! No graven images are permitted (Ex. 20:4-5). You shall have no other gods before me; i.e. “in my presence”.

Kyle Idleman, author of “Not a Fan” is also the author of another great read entitled, “god’s at war”. In this book Idleman reminds us that we are the recipients of many wonderful gifts from God, but these gifts can morph into idols in the hands of self-deifying sinners. Idleman identi-



fies Idolatry as the number one issue in the Bible. We are created & redeemed for worship. It is written, “You shall worship the LORD your God and Him only shall you serve.”

Our hearts are the “bunker hill” – the battleground of the gods (Matthew 15:17-19). The church is the bride of Jesus. Idolatry is adultery; i.e. a cheating spouse. “Let marriage be held in honor among all, & let the marriage bed be undefiled, for God will judge the sexually immoral & adulterous” (Hebrews 13:4)!

“We love others best when we love God most.”

Idelman shares this story: “Kylie Bisutti knew exactly what goals she was pursuing. She wanted to be a fashion model, & she succeeded at the highest level. In

2009, Bisutti won a competition against 10,000 rivals in the Victoria’s Secret Model search.”

“Just before her dreams came true, Bisutti had gotten married. She & her husband were followers of Christ, and she couldn’t help but think about what she was doing & the example she was setting. She realized there was a great deal of difference between modeling clothing & flaunting provocative undergarments.”

Bisutti writes, “I finally achieved my biggest dream, the dream I always wanted. But when I finally got it, it wasn’t all I thought it would be.” “Her greatest goal was unmasked as just another god that couldn’t deliver.”

“Ultimately it became a worship choice. So she turned in her wings and stepped down from lingerie modeling.”

“News from Jim & Diane Wagner”

Dear Friends and Supporters, Greeting in the Name of Jesus! It has been chilly in Vilnius, but not yet bitterly cold. The coldest night so far this winter was about 12 degrees F, which isn't bad for those of us raised in the upper Midwest. We hope the milder days continue, especially when our son John and his family are visiting. We are anxiously awaiting their arrival on 16 December.

Our ministry at the International Church has been a joy these last fifteen months. Attendance seems to hold at nearly thirty each week, and the lowest has been about nineteen – which is pretty good for this congregation. Sometimes we wish we were more successful in drawing the English-speaking community, but the regulars tell us the attendance is really good. Before we came there were evidently weeks when only six or eight people were present. We have also presided at several weddings (the 2 couples who are local have continued to attend!), two baptisms and one funeral. In addition there is a weekly lay-led bible study, a weekly women's bible study and a monthly young adult group. Sunday school is on-again off-again, depending on the children we have present any given Sunday. Last year there were more children than this year. All in all we believe that many are hearing and gladly receiving the Good News of Jesus' love and forgiveness. More than anything else, this is why we are here!

Worship and preaching have been both a joy and a challenge! Jim has been preaching without notes from the head of the aisle ever since we

arrived. It is a more-or-less new experience for him. Communication seems to be better but an old man's forgetfulness can also be a real problem! Choosing hymns continues to be a challenge since our people come from so many different backgrounds. The addition of our new Covenant Hymnals in May has been a great help and we are grateful to Lindsborg Covenant Church for this gift of love.

In the last few months Diane has been busier than last year. She continues to attend the bible studies and young adults' group, but is now also being called upon more regularly into a ministry with individual women. She has also been called upon to visit an expat in the local mental hospital.

Our social life here is a continual round of concerts and other events. These are good fun, but more importantly they are a chance to be visible in the English-speaking community. For example, last Saturday was the Danish Christmas Lunch, this Friday is the English Christmas Carol social, and this Saturday is the Swedish St. Lucia Festival. Then, Sunday evening is our own Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols. At a recent Danish event collar-clad Jim said to the Chamber President, "I just want to be visible." To which he responded, "Don't worry, you are!"

As many of you know, we were able to spend three weeks in India last summer at the home of one of our student members. It was an unforgettable experience. We did not travel much - although we did see the Taj Mahal - but we had a great time with his family, and Jim was able to preach seven times in nine days. It is nearly impossible

to describe what it is like preaching in a packed Pentecostal Church at 90 degrees F with no air conditioning. But again, Jim's messages seemed to be well-received. Our student was an excellent translator!

In September and October Diane spent 6 weeks back in the USA with our children & grandchildren as well as her 92 year old mother. She had a great time and now we are looking forward to eight or ten weeks back in the USA in early summer. Jim's 50th high school reunion is in July as is the ELCA Summer Missionary Conference, and we are expecting our twelfth grandchild in May. Perhaps we will see some of you as we make our way around the good old USA. We treasure your prayers and support!
