## Pastor’s Keyboard: “Discipleship: “A Real Godsend”

A Godsend is more than just good fortune or random luck. Discipleship is a real Godsend. It is a gift from God that keeps on giving. I remember the first time I laid my eyes on my bride to be. It was in the Science Building, on the last day of my freshman year at college. I didn’t thank my lucky stars that I had met the love of my life. I knew that God had brought a blessing into my life. My wife was and is a Godsend.

People often times refer to a particular gift or happening in life as a Godsend. What exactly do we mean by a Godsend? I suspect that we mean, “a benefit, blessing, boon, or benediction”. An unexpected or unplanned event or thing, turns out to be exactly what the doctor, the Great Physician—Jesus, ordered. A Godsend is a providential gift from God.

Christmas is a Godsend. “For God so loved the World that He gave His one and only Son to be the Savior of all people. God didn’t send His son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him.” To send is to deliver. God is the Sender and God is the Deliverer. God’s gift



of salvation required more than a “forever” postage stamp. God’s sending, which is priceless and eternal, required the sacrifice of God’s only begotten Son. The Godsend we receive at Christmas and throughout the year is the Incarnation.

Recently, my wife informed me that we had received 4 packages in the mail on a single day. “One of the packages,” she said, “Was in a manila envelope. You’ll never guess what was in it.” “Probably not,” I replied. Instead of playing 20 Questions, I asked, “So what was in the package?” I discovered that the envelope didn’t have a return address. Inside the envelope was 10 envelopes

with \$50.00 in each one, along with the printed text from John 3:16. The instructions were simple: “Share the Good News of Emmanuel. Give the cash to one or more people who are in need. No restrictions. Merry Christmas.”

Discipleship is a Godsend. God flips the switch and turns on the LIGHT, so that we can see, and then flip the switch and turn on the LIGHT for others. Jesus is the Light of the World for those who walk in darkness; for those who live in the land of deep darkness.

Some former parishioners of mine, Bob & Jan, owned a Furniture Store. Before I arrived in town, they had prayed that God would help them sell their store so that they could move to another town. God did not send a buyer their way. They were upset & angry with God. Years later, they confessed that “Not selling the business, & not moving was In Truth a Godsend!”

### **WOMEN’S BIBLE STUDY**

Women of Emmanuel and their friends will enjoy a **Five Session Bible Study on Solomon and his “Song of Songs”**. Solomon, the son of David and Bathsheba, is known for his wisdom and his many wives. He had 700 wives and 300 concubines. He was an excellent builder. He spent 7 years building the Jerusalem Temple and 13 years building his palace. He expanded the territory of Israel from the Mediterranean Sea to the Euphrates River; and from Dan to Beersheba. His treaties and harem of wives brought pagan influences into the Kingdom. His exploits produced high taxes and slave labor. Eventually, after his death, the United Kingdom divided into North (Israel) and South (Judah).

A participant in our recent study on the Psalms asked, “Do you think Solomon was really happy?” We know that two of the Psalms in the Psalter are attributed to Solomon: 72 and 127. However, we are told in 1 Kings 4:29-34 that Solomon wrote 1,005 songs and 3000 Proverbs. According to Christian and Jewish tradition, Solomon wrote his SONG early in his reign, PROVERBS toward the middle of his reign, and ECCLESIASTES at the end of his reign. The Song of Solomon is the opposite of Ecclesiastes; it is an upbeat love song between a man & a maiden (Christ & the Church).
