Pastor’s Keyboard: “Discipleship: Running the Race”

What race are we running?

A friend once told me, “Life for many people is a rat race. And even if you win, you’re still a rat.” When it comes to movies, a memorable line stands out, “Run, Forrest, Run!” When it comes to races, I have many friends who are avid runners. They train and they race. Some excel at sprinting, and others at long distance running or marathons. St. Paul says to his beloved Timothy, “*I have fought the good fight. I have finished the race. I have kept the faith*”—II Timothy 4:7.

Everyone is running a race, but as I watch the lives of people I love, I’ve noticed two types of runners: Those who are running with their hearts set on eternity; and those who are simply trying to outrun death.

Have you noticed that some people are paralyzed by the prospects of death & dying? They often write up “bucket lists” and attempt to squeeze out “every ounce of life” & “tick of the clock” before their proverbial number comes up. The assumption is that if I eat right, exercise right, and watch my “p’s and q’s” then I can at the very least get some more



time; an extension of life. The goal becomes simply trying to postpone the inevitable. But no one outruns death. Sooner or later it snags us all.

As a pastor, I have walked through the valley of the shadow of death with many a soul and many a family. I have witnessed slow, agonizing deaths, and sudden, unexpected deaths. There is no rhyme or reason in my mind for the senseless deaths of so many. But I also know that life and death cannot be reduced to luck, fate or a cosmic lottery system.

From dust we came and to dust we shall return. Death is the last enemy to be destroyed. The wages of sin is death. Our mortality hunts us and haunts us,

making us captive to fear. God is not the source of our mortality; sin is. God is the source of our immortality. Listen to these beloved words from St. Paul, “*When the perishable puts on the imperishable, & the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: ‘Death is swallowed up in victory.’ ‘O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?’ The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ*”—I Corinthians 15:54-57.

And so we run the race that is set before us. We run not from death, but toward Jesus, who is the author and finisher of our faith! Jesus is the gift of eternity for you and for me. He guarantees the finish line.

Recently, I was diagnosed with aggressive pancreatic cancer. This is not my fate or my recompense for

Emmanuel Huddle Highlights!

Emmanuel is now gathering for IN-PERSON worship as of June 1. RSVP's are no longer needed as seating has been reduced to allow for social distancing. Members are still asked to wear masks when arriving and leaving the church premises; especially when one is singing. Masks and hand sanitizer are both available at the entrance of the church building.

Thanks is offered to Fred and Sandra Troendle, who picked up and delivered our Emmanuel Stone commemorating the purchase date of our church land (December 27, 2019). This Stone, a gift from Brad and Peg Bellamy, will be blessed along with our church land on Sunday, August 2.

Emmanuel Lutheran's application for property tax exemption has been approved. The Land is assessed as Commercial Property and is valued at \$246,500 for 2021. ("Your application for exemption has been approved beginning for taxes payable in 2021. This exemption will remain, in place, so long as there is continued

progress for construction and eventual full Church use of your parcel.")

The Emmanuel Website now has a donor button allowing friends of Emmanuel to support God's holy work in Rochester.

On Sunday, August 2, Emmanuel will host its annual Church Picnic on our church land we also plan on blessing the land and dedicating it to the LORD for His glory and His holy purposes.

Emmanuel was approved for Payroll Protection Program and received \$11,800.

The new Emmanuel Church Member Picture Directory will be distributed by July 1.

Storage Space is needed by September 1 for the donated Baby Grand Piano (Gift from Vernon and Bridget Westbrook).

Pastor Dave will be enjoying a Week of Vacation with his family from Sunday-Saturday, July 5-11. Pastor Waldemar Gies will serve as our pulpit supply on July 11.

some particular sin. It is my mortality. Only God gets to decide when my race on earth is complete. I trust God's sovereignty. I know that cancer is an uninvited, trespasser in my body; a body which was created and redeemed by God for His glory. I know that, in Christ, my body is a Temple of the Holy Spirit. I know that all things are possible with God and that in everything God works for good with those who love Him and are called according to His purposes. Therefore I am receiving each day as a holy gift from God. With hundreds of prayer warriors running beside me, I am soaking in the WORD of God daily. I am praying that God would give my oncology team wisdom from above and glory to His name. Most importantly, I am praying that in all things, God would set my heart on eternity.

In the words of Pastor Timothy Keller, also recently diagnosed with pancreatic cancer: "I have terrific human doctors, but most importantly I have the Great Physician himself caring for me. Pray for God to use medical means or his direct intervention to make the cancer regress to the point of vanishing. For my wife and me, that we use this opportunity to be weaned from the joys of this world and to desire God's presence above all. For my family to be comforted and encouraged. For the side effects of treatment to allow me to continue writing and speaking."

Dear friends in Christ, we can't outrun death; we need not try. Jesus has conquered death & the crown of righteousness awaits us all. We run the race set before us with joy, because Jesus ran an infinitely harder race, with joy, for us. We press on toward the goal, for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus. We run with Jesus, and by His grace we keep the faith and finish the race.

The NALC Disaster Response stepped in and, with the labor of SEMAC, home and hope were both restored. Larry and his crew were able to insulate the home, put in new flooring, sheetrock, & a shower stall, and repair plumbing and some electrical outlets. Dale is currently battling cancer. His daughter also worked with the guys. She also provided the group with lunch each day. The neighbors were so grateful

that they hosted a big picnic meal before the SEMAC TEAM headed home on June 19.

June 5, 2020—Zoom Meeting:

Income for the month of May was \$8,280. Expenses for the month were \$3,186 (offset by PPP funding). Presently our YTD shortfall is only \$4,336. In-Person worship resumed on June 6.
