Pastor’s Keyboard: “Discipleship: “Remembering”

The repentant thief on the cross confesses his sin and asks for mercy. “Jesus, remember me *when* you come into our Kingdom”. Jesus, as you may recall, responds with a definite TODAY: “Today you will be with me in Paradise.”

It’s the Season of Lent and God commands us to remember. Remembering is not just recalling a past event, or happening. It’s not just thinking about facts or information. It is not just a cognitive activity. To remember is to actively participate in the gift of promise and fulfillment.

In a garden cemetery, on the first day of the week, angels addressed grieving women with these words, “Why do you seek the living among the dead? Jesus is not here, but has risen. Remember how He told you, while He was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men and be crucified and on the third day rise?” And they remembered!

Memory is a precious thing. People sometimes refer to momentary memory loss as a senior moment. Memory loss is no laughing matter. I remember Mildred Shelley. She battled Alzheimer’s. When her husband Helmer died, I officiated at the funeral. Mildred stood at the



head of the casket, greeting those who came to pay their respects. I hugged Mildred and said, “I’m sorry for your loss.” Mildred said, “Did you know him?” I replied, “Not well, but I wish that I had known Helmer better.”

Mildred broke down and wept, “Helmer? Is this my Helmer? Oh no!” I felt so bad that I had caused such anguish to Mildred. By the time the funeral was over, Mildred was back in the cocoon I call Alzheimer’s. She had no recollection that her husband of 60 years was dead. Then I realized, that God in His mercy had brought Mildred out of this shell, briefly, so that she could experience appropriate grieving. She needed to remember Helmer, and the life God had given them.

I read an article recently about a North Carolina couple who have an eight

year old daughter named Keira, who suffers from childhood Alzheimer’s. Keira’s rare genetic condition (Sanfilippo syndrome) was diagnosed in 2015. In April 2016, Keira’s parents captured her saying, “I love you” on camera. They had no idea that it would be the last time they’d hear these words from their daughter.

Keira’s father, Dave Esposito, said, “As a parent [you] know the firsts, the first time they take the first step, the first words they say, you know you record those dates, you know you can play those back. You never know or expect when the last time they’re going to say something is and we just feel amazing and really lucky that we captured the last time she said [‘I love you’] on film.”

Since that 2016 video, Keira’s condition has continued to worsen. She can’t speak at all now. Eventually she will lose the ability to walk & eat before her organs start to fail, but her parents are trying to focus on enjoying the moments they have left with her. Keira’s mom,

Elise, said, “Keira's our entire world. She's the biggest blessing that we've ever had. She brings us joy every single day especially with her laughter and constant smiles.” Looking back on the "I love you" video is hard for them now.

Discipleship is about remembering. By the grace of God, we remember. We remember the Sabbath Day to keep it holy. We remember our Lord's promise of the Third Day. We remember our Lord's Sermon on the Mount. The command is clear: “If while offering our gifts at the altar, we remember that our brother has something against us, we are to leave our gifts at the altar and first find reconciliation with our brother.” We cannot have reconciliation with God and not be reconciled with one another. We remember the Last Supper, when Jesus took bread and wine and said, “This is my body and my blood, given and shed for you, for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in remembrance of me.” The rooster crowed and Peter remembered the saying of Jesus, “Before the rooster crows you will deny me three times.” And Peter went out and wept bitterly.

What aids you with remembering? Post-It notes? Planners and calendars? A string tied around your finger? A note in your pocket or a message on the wall? A close friend? We may have memory lapses, but God never forgets. Not because He chooses to hold a grudge and get even, but because it is His character to forgive. Speaking through the Prophet Jeremiah (Chapter 31), God promised to write His new covenant, not on tablets of stone, but on human hearts. God promised that He would remember our sins no more. God chooses to remember us with the grace of Jesus forever. He has engraved our names on the palm of His hands (Isaiah 49:16). Jesus remembers me, and you too!

Hall of Fame quarterback, Brett Favre recently said, “Tomorrow I may not remember who I am.” We may forget or not remember. I am grateful that we have a Heavenly Father who forever remembers us, and recalls our sins no more.
