## Pastor's Keyboard: "Discipleship: Everyday Missionaries"

Rise, Shine, You People! Indeed, we are empowered & commissioned for rising. But for what purpose. *"Tell how the Father sent His Son to save us. Tell of the Son who life & freedom gave us. Tell how the Spirit calls from every nation, His new creation!"* To rise and shine is to GO AND TELL! We are Everyday Missionaries!

Recently, I had the good fortune of participating in a SEMAC mission trip in Dayton, Ohio. Our servant group, under the leadership of Larry Vomhof, stayed at Salem Lutheran Church in West Alexandria, Ohio. The members of this NALC congregation have a "missional mindset." They practice their discipleship, eagerly, in daily life.

During our stay, a man by the name of Jack presented me with two books by Greg Finke. My flight home from Ohio got delayed for six hours in Detroit. In everything God works for good. During my delay, I read the first of two books that Jack gave me. The title of Finke's first book is, Joining Jesus on His Mission: How to Be an Everyday Missionary."

Discipleship is at the center of what it means to be a



follower of Jesus and a member of the NALC. Finke's premise is this: "We're not on a mission *for* Jesus but *with* Jesus!" What's the difference you ask? Finke writes, "The first time I realized that Jesus was inviting me to come *with* him and not *go for* him was a great relief. If I go *for* Jesus, I am doing the work and seeing the results of what I can accomplish. When I go *with* Jesus, he is doing the work and I am seeing the results of what Jesus can accomplish."

When we do something *for* Jesus, we are in the driver's seat, earning what we get. But when we do something *with* Jesus, Jesus is in the driver's seat. We keep company with our Lord, who gives us daily grace.

Jesus went to the cross for our salvation. God has saved us for **missional living** in our neighborhoods. Joining Jesus on His redemptive mission is what it means to live missional. *As we go* (Matthew 28:19-20), we make disciples of all nations. *Actually*, God does the making. But God uses His church, His everyday missionaries to baptize & teach. Discipleship is contagious. Being a disciple...makes disciples.

What is the mindset and faith practices needed if one is to be an everyday missionary? Ask yourself, "How is Jesus messing with me?" Ask yourself, "Who is God readying and ripening in my neighborhood?" Jesus is in charge of readying and ripening. Our job is to watch for people who are ripe. Finke writes, "This is our new missional mindset: We know Jesus is already out there in our neighborhoods doing the heavy lifting of

ripening people for their next step toward his Father's redemption?" Remember, we are joining Jesus on His mission. So stop stalling. "It's better to do something imperfectly than to do nothing flawlessly." Joining Jesus on his redemptive mission is simply a matter of enjoying people, and then seeking, recognizing, and responding to what Jesus is already doing in the lives of the people we are enjoying. Authentic friendship is an "*agenda-less friendship.*" Finke writes, "Our 'agenda' is to have no other agenda than to enjoy the person and watch for how Jesus unfolds *his* agenda."

Neighborhood missionaries ask, "How can I join Jesus in what He is already doing here?" During the Season of Lent we can prayerfully ask, "Jesus, what are you up to today?" and then, "How would you have me join you?" In the midst of our chronological lives (*Chronos*), we need to watch for divine appointments and sacred opportunities (*Kairos*). Jesus is on a mission. Redemption is what Jesus does. Everyday missionaries don't believe in coincidences; they believe in God-incidences. In the words of Jesus, "The Kingdom of God is Now!"

We are both beneficiaries & agents of God restoring His created world. A missional mindset and the necessary mission practices is God's gift to Everyday Missionaries. Finke writes, "The 5 Practices (Seeking the Kingdom, Hearing from Jesus, Talking with People, Doing Good, & Ministering through Prayer) are not what we do when we *go* to church. The 5 Practices are what we do when we go out to *be* the Church and join Jesus in our everyday lives."

Let me close with a final thought from Finke as we journey through Lent: "Wherever you go, there you are, & wherever you are, Jesus is already up to something." God wants us to move on from Bible Study to Bible Doing! The invitation is "For you!" Our Lord's commission really is a great commission. We are, IN CHRIST, everyday missionaries.

## Lutherans for Life

The facts don't lie. The most recent data available shockingly reveals that in 2016 more black babies were killed by abortion than were born in New York City. In 2016 black abortions accounted for nearly 40% of all abortions in NYC. Out of 59,854 total abortions reported in NYC, nearly 67 percent were committed on minority black (23,209) and Hispanic women (16,718). According to the CDC, in 2016, NYC also had the highest overall abortion ratio of the selected states they reviewed, committing 519 abortions per 1,000 live births.

### **Church Council Highlights:**

**February 6, 2020:** We're starting off the new year financially well. Our January income was \$10,654, and our expenses were \$9,260. As is our custom, we submitted first fruits mission dollars to the following ministry partners: SEMAC, NALS, & the NALC. Pastor's pension was also submitted. Pastor noted that Sharon Matzke is taking a break from playing at Madonna Towers. MarJean Damerval and Mary Ann Groven will be our primary worship pianists for this missional outreach. The building team is meeting with Pete Schuller (AB Systems) and putting together a site plan for our

church land. The Audit Committee will make sure that we have insurance for our church land and for the baby grand piano. We welcome our newest Emmanuel member, Andy Peterson. Save the date: Our next annual meeting will be on Saturday, January 30, 2021. Pastor Dave shared information with us regarding "India Transformed," a ministry partner of the NALC. The next Council Meeting will be held on Friday, March 6 at 1pm.

**Trinity Lutheran Church:** A new mission congregation has been launched in St. Charles, MN. Please pray for our sisters and brothers at Trinity Lutheran. Pastor Dave & Pastor Gies are offering pulpit supply to our friends in St. Charles. May God guide and bless the growth of Trinity.

## **North American Lutheran Church Update**

- How many congregations are in the NALC? There are now more than 437 congregations in the NALC, 17 of which joined in 2019. A new mission congregation has launched in St. Charles, MN, which may become a sister congregation to Emmanuel in the near future. Keep Trinity Lutheran of St. Charles, in your prayers.
- What percentage of the NALC congregations are mission congregations or house churches? More than 15% (i.e. 66+ congregations).
- Where do NALC Missionaries serve? They serve in Belarus, Congo, Haiti, Tanzania, and elsewhere.
- How many future NALC seminarians are presently preparing for ordination? 40+future pastors are in seminary; most of whom are receiving full or partial tuition scholarships.
- Where has the NALC Disaster Response been active? Under the leadership of Mary Bates, NALC funds and members have offered Christ-centered compassion and aid to people who have experienced flooding in the Midwest, tornadoes in Ohio (SEMAC in Dayton), earthquakes in California, & continued rebuilding in areas affected by hurricanes. No Federal funds are received.
- What is a primary emphasis in the NALC? Life to Life Discipleship; disciples making disciples!
