Pastor’s Keyboard: “Discipleship: “Easter Rocks & Rolls!”

Are you ready to rock and roll? I am referencing an idiomatic expression that means, “ready to move, to start doing something”. I am not referring to the slang usage of this phrase as a sexual euphemism.

I was born on June 3, 1957 and baptized into the body of Christ on June 16, 1957. Rock and Roll was a big deal in the 1950’s. Names like Buddy Holly, Elvis Presley, Fats Domino, Chuck Berry, Little Richard, and Ricky Nelson were household names. Rock and Roll was a particular genre of music and dancing. Some people loved it. And some people didn’t.

Easter Rocks and Rolls; not just once in a blue moon, but daily in the life a Christ-Follower. Baptized into the death and resurrection of Jesus, we are “on the move and doing something” of eternal significance. We find ourselves in the Season of Easter, which is 50 days long. Jesus died for our sins and handed over His Spirit on a Good Friday cross. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, we are rocking & rolling to the glory of God.

In Mark 16, we read that on the first day of the week



several women brought spices to the grave of Jesus so that they might anoint his corpse. The first day of the week was a work day. The women were “ready to move and to start doing something”. They were ready to rock and roll. Little did they know, when the day began, that God had a Great Commission in store for them!

“Angels, roll the rock away; Death yield up thy mighty prey! See, the Savior leaves the tomb, Glowing in immortal bloom.”

One item dominated their conversation, “Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?” Graves, in those days, were often hollowed out clefts in a rock. A large stone, disk-shaped and several feet in diameter, was rolled in a hewn channel to seal off the entrance of the tomb. Moving that stone would have required the help of an

animal or several men.

Arriving at the cemetery, the women looked up and saw that the stone had been rolled away. It was VERY LARGE. Entering the tomb, the women received an Easter Proclamation: “Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen Indeed! Get moving and start doing something. Don’t be afraid. Go and tell His disciples, & Peter, that He is going before you to Galilee. There you will see Him, just as He told you!”

Wow! Rock & Roll didn’t start in the 1940’s with Sister Rosetta Tharpe. Rock and Roll began at a Garden Tomb around the year 30 AD. So what did the women, who went to the tomb, saw the stone rolled away, heard the Easter message, do? Mark seizes the moment & ends his Gospel with a preposition: “They went out and fled from the tomb, for trembling & astonishment had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, they were afraid for.”

Do you remember how St. Mark began his Gospel. Permit me to remind you: “The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God!” Mark begins his Jesus Story with a declaration. Mark lets the “cat out of the bag”. There are not many gospels (good newses). There is only ONE GOOD NEWS. Jesus is the source and content of Good News! In Christ, a new Genesis is beginning. A “gospel” is “a victory announced beforehand”. From page one, we know how this Jesus Story is going to end! Does the ending of Mark’s Gospel surprise or disappoint you? I hope not. God has chosen each one of us to Rock and Roll with the good news of Easter. We don’t have to be afraid. We can go and tell. God is determined to use us to finish His story. Each one of us must write the ending of this story in our own lives.

I grew up on a farm. Rocks were plentiful. Picking rocks was a chore. I needed to roll those pesky stones away. When the stones were large, I needed the help of friends or a front-end loader. I also enjoyed collecting rocks; especially agates. When I met the woman of my dreams, my Julie, I placed a stone (rock) on her finger, and God made us one flesh in holy Christian Marriage. Jesus is the Bridegroom and we are His redeemed bride. “On this ROCK,” Jesus declares, “I will build MY Church, & the gates of hell will not prevail against it.” We are Easter people, commissioned to Rock and Roll for the Glory of God. Easter Rocks and Rolls!

The Bible identifies Jesus as the ROCK of our salvation (Psalm 118:22). Jesus, a stone rejected by the builders, has become the cornerstone. St. Paul, writing to the Christians in Corinth, references the Wilderness Wanderings and says, “Our ancestors all drank from the Spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ.” St. Peter writes a baptismal homily and encourages his hearers to “grow up into salvation”. We have tasted that the LORD is good and so we come to Him, a Living Stone, & like living stones we are being built up as a spiritual house to be a holy priesthood. “We are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God’s own people, so that we may proclaim the wonderful deeds of Him who called us out of darkness into His marvelous light”—I Peter 2:1ff. Christ is Risen Indeed! Go & Tell!
