DAY THIRTEEN: EPIPHANY

January 6

Lesson: Matthew 2:1-12

L: This is the Word of the Lord.
C: Thanks be to God. *Ring bells.*

Epiphany means manifestation, revelation, God's appearance in God's creation. There are many different traditions that are used during this time. The purpose of Epiphany is to honor the visit of the Magi. In some places there will be a party with a cake with a bean, or a coin, baked in it. Whoever gets the bean in their piece is the king or queen for the evening. Sometimes they have more of a responsibility; they also have to host the party carnival before Lent starts on Shrove (Fat) Tuesday. On the Eve of Three Kings Day in Puerto Rico, children put hay in their shoes and place them outside for the animals of the Magi as they go by. When the hay is gone in the morning, they find toys or candy in its place. In Italy, Befana leaves surprises. The name Befana is from the word epiphany. A cranky fellow named Rodolfo joins her, threatening people with punishment if they have been naughty. Befana wanted to join the Magi in search of the Christ but at the last minute lost her courage. We've all lost our courage at some point. So now on every Epiphany she goes from house to house searching for Christ. Everywhere she goes, she sees Christ in everyone she meets.

Tonight’s Service is very informal. Keeping the Twelve Days started back in 567 A.D.; the purpose of which was to allow God’s people more time to reflect upon and celebrate the gift of the Incarnation (God with us in the flesh). Some start counting THE DAYS on December 25, others start on December 26 and run through Epiphany (the arrival of the Magi). So we have a dozen, or perhaps a baker’s dozen of DAYS. We welcome your bells! *You are invited to ring your bell at any time that the Spirit moves you, but especially after the reading of Scripture. After the reading of Scripture, the Reader will say, “This is the Word of the Lord,” and the response from you, along with the ringing of the bells, is “Thanks be to God.”*

THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS

DAY ONE: CHRISTMAS DAY December 25

Lesson: Luke 2:7

- L: This is the Word of the Lord.
- C: **Thanks be to God.** *Ring bells.*

Christmas is a joyous proclamation of God’s coming in the form of humanity – the human, Jesus – Emmanuel, God With Us, bringing power and love. Christmas is a feast, a mass (Christ-mass), celebrating the birth of Jesus. Let us reclaim these days, proclaiming God’s presence, our unity in Christ, and our response to God’s good news.

DAY TWO: SAINT STEPHEN’S DAY December 26

Lesson: Acts 6:1-15, 7:54-60

- L: This is the Word of the Lord.
- C: **Thanks be to God.** *Ring bells.*

The early church dedicated the first/second day of Christmas to Stephen, the first martyr, patron saint of deacons and diaconal ministers, and for those who serve in the faith. As the first martyr, Stephen is given the most honorable day, right next to Christmas. It is called Boxing Day in England – it would be easy to assume that people fight each other – but this is not so. What it really means is that food from the feast is boxed up to go out into the community, to the poor – food, not fighting.

GIFT OF MUSIC: “Good King Wenceslas”

If you listen closely to the words of this song, you will learn the story of a good man who lived out his faith by taking care of the poor as Jesus directs us to do. Good King Wenceslas, a Bohemian prince born in A.D. 903, was known for his charity to the poor. On Saint Stephen’s Day, we remember those who serve; and we serve.

DAY THREE: SAINT JOHN, APOSTLE & EVANGELIST December 27

Lesson: John 1:1-5, 21:20-25

- L: This is the Word of the Lord.
- C: **Thanks be to God.** *Ring bells.*

John’s Gospel tells the story of the incarnation (God in flesh). The Word becomes flesh and dwells among us full of grace and truth. Jesus is crucified and raised from the dead for the forgiveness of our sins. This is how God loves the world: God gives His only Son. St. John was a bishop in the early church, in Ephesus, which is in present-day Turkey. John was always calling on Christians to “love one another”.

DAY FOUR: THE HOLY INNOCENTS December 28

Lesson: Matthew 2:13-18

- L: This is the Word of the Lord.
- C: **Thanks be to God.** *Ring bells.*

We remember that Herod was a bloodthirsty, horrid person. He murdered members of his own family, killing 3 of his sons. He felt that his throne was threatened, & he had no scruples in murdering the innocent children of Bethlehem to protect that throne. We read this story in the celebration of the twelve days, because there will always be the innocent, the victims. We should remember them and pray for them.

DAY FIVE: NATIVITY December 29

Lesson: Luke 2:8-16

- L: This is the Word of the Lord.
- C: **Thanks be to God.** *Ring bells.*

This is a familiar picture. Animals were present at Christmas time. They are a favorite part of every nativity scene – the sheep, the cattle, the donkey, the camels. This is a reminder of God’s goodness in creation, and it is used to illustrate peace and living together unthreatened.
