Pastor's Keyboard: "Discipleship - "Jesus Said WHAT?"

"Did I hear what I think I heard?" *"He said WHAT?"* Sometimes a person's words are so shocking that we catch ourselves in disbelief, wondering if in fact we heard correctly, wanting a rewind and a replay?

Recently, I viewed John Ortberg's DVD series, "Who Is This Man?" Ortberg is a pastor of Menlo Park Presbyterian Church in Menlo Park, California. Several things jumped off the screen and into my head & heart as I listened to his lectures. A case in point: "Jesus said things that didn't always sit well with his audience. He angered and infuriated his listeners. He confused his followers. He amazed people by what he said & did. *Jesus said WHAT?*"

"Where did this man get this wisdom and these mighty works? Is not this the carpenter's son? They took offense at Him." - Matthew 13:53-58,

This month we are considering some of the hard to hear sayings that Jesus - the Word of God - spoke to His disciples. Remember, Jesus didn't just talk the talk. He



actually walked the walk. Jesus practiced what he preached. And so must we, by the grace of God.

In the Ancient World, it was assumed that one would love their friends and hate their enemies. But Jesus commanded his followers to love their enemies, pray for their persecutors, turn the other cheek, go the extra mile, & to forgive 70 x 7. *Jesus said WHAT?*

Blessed are you when people hate you and when they exclude you and revile you and spurn your name as evil, on account of the Son of Man! - Luke 6:22

Jesus said, "Therefore, I say to you, every sin and blasphemy will be forgiven people, but blasphemy against the Spirit will not be forgiven." - Mt. 12:31. Jesus is talking about an unpardonable sin. Speaking about family values, Jesus said, "Think not

that I came to bring peace. Not peace, but a sword and fire. I came to set children against their parents and parents against their children. Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me." - Mt. 10:34-39. Jesus also said, "Leave the dead to bury the dead." - Luke 8:57-62. Jesus doesn't lower the bar to make following him more palatable or easy. Jesus raises the bar.

In Matthew 5:29 Jesus says, "If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away." In Mark 10, Jesus tells a rich man to "go, sell all of his possessions, give to the poor, come and follow." The rich man is told to renounce all of his possessions if he wishes to have treasure in heaven. In John 6, Jesus said, "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood you have no life in

"Mind your manners, St Paul!"

Archbishop Justin Welby, the 105th Archbishop of Canterbury & the most senior bishop in the Church of England, has told Christians firmly that we should not "proselytize" or talk about our faith to non-Christians until they invite us to do so.

It is a pity that St Paul didn't have the benefit of the Archbishop's guidance before he set out -- without being asked -- on his 3 missionary voyages in which he founded churches among the pagans in such cities as Philippi, Ephesus and Corinth. The presence of the finger-wagging, politically-correct Mr. Welby on the quayside before St Paul boarded his ship would have saved the Apostle a great deal of trouble: the thirty-nine lashes he received (5 times), an attempt to stone him & his shipwreck.

How ironic that Welby should choose the season of Pentecost to issue his injunction for, according to chapter two of The Acts of the Apostles, this was the day when the disciples of Jesus experienced the rushing mighty wind of the Holy Ghost and tongues of fire upon their heads and immediately rushed -- all uninvited -- out into the Jerusalem streets to preach to members of every race under the sun: Parthians, Medes, Elamites, dwellers in Mesopotamia, Cretes and Arabians and all the rest. — *Continued from page 1* ... you.” Many of Jesus’ disciples when they heard these words said, “This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?” After this many of Jesus’ disciples turned back and no longer walked with Him.

Was Jesus exaggerating to make a point; speaking perhaps in hyperbole? Or was He, dare we say it, dead serious? When someone genuinely loves another person, they realize that nothing less than the TRUTH will suffice. In John 8, Jesus was asked to condemn a woman caught in the act of adultery. Jesus says to the accusers, “Whoever is without sin can throw the first stone.” After writing in the dirt, Jesus looks at the woman & says, “Where are your accusers?” She replies, “There are none.” Jesus says, “Neither do I condemn you. Go and sin no more.” *Jesus said WHAT?* You mean I can't sin all the more that grace may abound? “Be a sinner & sin boldly, but believe & rejoice in Christ even more boldly.” Grace isn't a license for sin.

In John 4, Jesus had to go through Samaria. It was a Spirit-driven necessity. After exchanging peasantries with a Samaritan Woman, Jesus offers her Living Water that gushes up to eternal life. It is hers, just for the asking. Then Jesus asks her to bring her husband. Sin cannot be ignored. Forgiveness is only for sinners. The Samaritan Woman perceives that Jesus is a Prophet. She changes the topic from sin to worship. Jesus tells her that Samaritans worship what they do not know & Jews worship what they know, for *THE SALVATION* is from the Jews. *Jesus said WHAT?* He wasn't being politically correct or inter-faith tolerant. He says that not all religions are equal. The Salvation is found only in Christ. The Samaritan Woman says, “When Messiah comes He will reveal the TRUTH. Jesus says, “I AM!” The Samaritan Woman leaves her jar at the well & becomes a preacher, sharing the gusher of Living Water with other Samaritans.

Jesus wasn't trying to be offensive. He didn't enjoy watching His listeners squirm. But He knew that only THE TRUTH can make us free indeed. So here's a thought. Summer is fast approaching. Maybe instead of trying to soft-pedal the hard words of Jesus, we might want to actually “wrestle well” with them. Remember how He told you, “Unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone. But if it dies, it bears much fruit.” Bonhoeffer said, “When Christ calls a man, He bids him come and die.” There is no escaping the TRUTH. Jesus is THE WAY to the Father. There is salvation in no other name (Acts 4:12)!

If only the wise, admonitory and well-mannered Mr. Welby had been there to say, "Never mind the promptings of the Holy Ghost, St Peter! Mind your P's and Q's! Wait till you're asked!"

And if we go back a little earlier to the life of Our Lord himself, we can imagine -- if only Welby had been there to quieten Jesus' enthusiasm -- his command "Go ye therefore & teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father & of the Son and of the Holy Ghost" would never have been given. Or at the very least Jesus would surely have toned down his command to something more polite such as, "Go & ask those pagans if they'd like to join an Alpha course! Tell them there's red wine and pizza afterwards!" Christian history would have turned out quite differently, if only Jesus had minded his manners.

But Welby's verbal facility is not limited to the occasional sound-bite, such as "Don't proselytize!" He is capable of quite extraordinary prolixity. How's this for an example of what Humpty Dumpty called "Impenetrability"? In his Pentecost speech, he went on to say: "I draw the line in terms of respect for the other; in starting by listening before you speak; in terms of love that is unconditional and not conditional to one iota, to one single element, on how the person responds to your own declaration of faith; and of not speaking about faith unless you are asked about faith."

That is an utterance so syntactically obscure that Welby's predecessor, the Great Obfuscator, Rowan Williams himself, would have been proud of it.
