Pastor's Keyboard: "Discipleship: On Display!"

What's on display? And for what purpose? Throughout the 50 Days of Easter we are singing, "Jesus is risen and we shall arise: Give God the glory! Alleluia!"


When I was in High School and in college, I worked at a Super Valu Grocery Store. I would sometimes put up a display. My High School had a Display Case, front and center, as one entered the building. Teachers put up displays. There's nothing quite so magical as a classroom plastered in beautiful display work.

I have visited Washington D.C. where the Smithsonian (World's largest museum) showcases more than 155 million artifacts, works of art, and natural science specimens. In my home, our refrigerator serves as our family display case. We also have a picture "wall of fame" in our basement, showcasing photos of our family.

The question must be asked, "What's on Display?" Why do we display things? There are several reasons for creating displays. Included items indicate what we value, celebrate & consider important. We display our trophies, accomplishments, and victories. Displays



feature items that are on sale or new in our store inventory so as to catch the attention of shoppers and visitors; inviting consumers to buy or belong. Displays can emphasize compassion and stir generosity, like the "New Life Baby Shower" or the "Soup to Go" for the Salvation Army.



When it comes to Discipleship, what's on display? St. Paul writes, "We are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them." Jesus, in His Sermon on the Mount, tells us that WE ARE the salt of the earth and the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hid." We are God's Display Case. So what's the purpose of being on display? Not to toot our own horn or to inflate our egos. The purpose of "letting our lights shine before others" is so that God gets ALL the glory. Discipleship is our Godgiven opportunity to showcase the Father's forever love for us in the gift of His Son. Jesus is the True Vine and we are His fruitbearing branches. We fast, pray and give alms so that God may get the praise as we care for our neighbors.

What's on display? During the Season of Easter, we are proclaiming the gift of the Third Day. We are practicing resurrection in daily life. The habit of our hearts is the promise of eternal life. We seek more Jesus! We share the good news of Easter so that our joy may be complete. "This is LOVE (agape)," St. John writes, "Not that we loved God, but that God loved us and sent His Son to be the forgiveness of our sins."

Soli Deo Gloria! We are God's display case for Christ's sake! Like our refrigerator face, our display may be untidy and a bit of a mess, but it showcases what is essential and of utmost importance: The glory of God! St. Paul writes, "We have this treasure in penny clay pots to show that the transcendent power belongs to God and not to us. For what we preach is not ourselves, but Jesus Christ as Lord, with ourselves as your servants for Jesus' sake." The Great I AM (Jesus) reside and abides in us for our salvation, God's glory, and the good of our neighbor.

A beautiful Children's Song, (Rise and Shine"—The Arky, Arky Song), contains these words, "Rise and shine and give God the glory, glory! Rise and shine and (clap once) give God the glory, glory! (Raise hands to shoulder level and sway back and forth.) Children of the Lord." God puts us on display to show the world His glory. Are we giving others a saving taste of Jesus? The "shout out" is always for God's glory, not our self acclaim. We may be the only Bible some folks ever read. Talk is cheap. Actions speak louder than words. Jesus (THE WORD of God) illustrates, demonstrates, and performs God's Word! Jesus says, "I am the Good Shepherd. I lay down my life for my sheep." Jesus says it and then does it. His WORD is His ACTION for you. Alleluia!

Discipleship on Display for the Glory of God! This is our worshiping Hymn of Praise. <u>C.S. Lewis writes</u>, "A man can no more diminish God's glory by refusing to worship Him than a lunatic can put out the sun by scribbling the word, 'darkness' on the walls of his cell." "Don't steal the Glory!" (Isaiah 60:1; Hebrews 1:3; 2 Corinthians 4:4; Phil. 2:9-11)

Emmanuel Huddle Highlights

Members of Emmanuel met on <u>April 17</u> for a time of conversation & information sharing. The Huddle included a presentation from the "Building for the Future" Implementation Team. Highlights include:

1. First quarter budget shows that expenses have exceeded income by about \$5,600. But we have paid pastor's retirement, & our issuance premiums for the entire year. We have also submitted \$2,500 of our 2021 budgeted benevolences. 2. Handouts were distributed: Updated Membership List with contact information, & the "m & m's of Emmanuel Lutheran" - summarizing our mission and ministries. 3. "Building for the Future" Pre-steps & First steps were reviewed. A proposal (Next Steps), to be considered at the April 24 congregational meeting was discussed. The proposal includes spending money already available in the Building Fund, which will provide a driveway from the Access Road, parking area, electrical service, shelter, & a portable storage shed, and necessary permits. 4. Announcements: a) The Lord's Supper will be distributed during worship with pre-filled cups on May 8 & 22. b) Dave & Kimberly Evenson (Bothun Family) are donating playground equipment for use on our church land. c) A church sign, announcing the presence of Emmanuel, will be placed on the church land in the near future. d) LeRoy Quam is working on a Cross for our church property.

Congregational Meeting Summary

Emmanuel held a special congregational meeting on April 24 following worship. 29 covenant members were present. The following motion was passed: "That the membership of Emmanuel Lutheran Church approve the allocation of funds from the Designated Building Fund #357, not to exceed \$90,000, which will accomplish the following steps in our "Building to Serve" Plan of Action: Driveway from Access Road, Parking Area, Electrical Service, Shelter, and a Portable Storage Shed, and necessary permits. Work to be performed by AB Systems (Peter Schuller)." Only one "no" vote was cast. All other votes were "yes". Thanks to everyone who attended the meeting.
